Personal Statement

I am a mountaineer working on climbing the highest mountain in every country on earth. I have so far climbed the highest mountain in 144 out of 196 countries. Sometimes the highpoint of a country is unknown or even unclimbed, and I bring professional surveying equipment to figure it out.

This project has required a range of skill sets. I've climbed many high-altitude technical peaks like K2 without oxygen and without Sherpa support, and Peak Pobeda (7439m) in Kyrgyzstan alpine style via the Abalakov route. I've attempted to climb Mt Everest solo without oxygen but had to turn around at 8500m after spending 40 hours in the death zone waiting out high winds. I've also climbed all the Snow Leopard peaks, the third American to do so.

I've done expeditions in Yukon climbing Mt Logan, in northern Ellesmere Island making many first ascents in the British Empire Range, and in the Ragged Range in the Northwest Territories putting up new big wall routes up to 30 pitches on unclimbed peaks.

I've discovered and surveyed new country highpoints in six countries (Uzbekistan, Saudi Arabia, Gambia, Togo, Guinea Bissau, and Colombia). The Uzbekistan highpoint, Alpomish (4668m), was previously unclimbed and unsurveyed, and I made the first ascent.

I learned mountaineering skills while studying mechanical engineering at MIT and climbed all 50 US state highpoints while in graduate school there. After completing my PhD in 2015 I moved to Seattle, where I am currently a Professor in Mechanical Engineering at Seattle University.

When not on international expeditions, I've done many first winter ascents of peaks in the Cascades, and put up several new technical rock routes. I've so far made 46 first winter ascents, such as Hard Mox, one of the most difficult peaks in Washington. I've also made notable second winter ascents, such as Forbidden Peak in January 2021.
